

WHAT NOT TO PACK

Certain items should never be packed. It is important for you to understand which items can cause a safety hazard. Heat from the sun can raise temperatures inside a closed moving truck to more than 150 degrees. Even in the middle of winter, heat will build up inside. Many common items including aerosol hair spray or cleaning products can trigger an explosion or fire that could destroy your possessions when packed inside of a truck.

Because moving trucks travel through warm climates or high altitudes (both dangerous to pressurized containers) to reach destination, packers and drivers are trained not to pack or load any articles which may be explosive. For your own safety, make sure that no member of your family packs those items in a container to be moved. Please review the below list carefully.

Any aerosol can including but not limited to the following:

- Shaving Cream
- Cleaning Products
- Insecticides
- Deodorants
- Spray Starch
- Spray Paint

Other flammable products:

- Oil-based paints
- Lacquer Remover
- Muriatic Acid
- Nail Polish
- Auto or Household Batteries
- Pesticides
- Fireworks
- Gasoline
- Lighter Fluid
- Matches
- Pool Chemicals
- Paint Thinners/Turpentine
- Bleach
- Ammonia
- Nail Polish Remover
- Fertilizer
- Charcoal
- Fire Extinguisher
- Propane in Tanks
- Ammunition
- Kerosene
- Motor Oil
